The origin of the Giglio Di Sant' Antonio feast in America can be traced back to immigrants from Brusciano who migrated to East 106th Street in East Harlem and the surrounding streets in the early 1900's. History states that at one time the East Harlem section of Manhattan had the largest Italian American community in America.

East Harlem had its 1st Giglio feast in honor of Sant' Antonio in 1908. Gioacchino Vivolo who migrated to New York from Brusciano in December of 1907 is credited with being the 1st Capo Paranza for the 106th Street feast. He and his brother Rocco Vivolo formed "The Bruscianese Society" which ran the feast for many years.

Descendents of these immigrants still participate in the feast today. They are the force behind this wonderful festival. Our devotion to Sant' Antonio as we dance the Giglio is the same as our ancestors from Brusciano who instilled the devotion, pride, passion we have for our Festa Di Sant' Antonio today in East Harlem!
